# SUNDAY 24th SEPTEMBER 2023 at 6.00pm

Alan Saggerson. *Organ Phantasticus*. Organist here at St Paul's since Advent Sunday 2019 having come from St Mary's, South Hampstead – drawn by the fabulous Forster & Andrews (1881) instrument. At this recital Alan will demonstrate the versatility of this organ with a programme of music in the *stylus phantasticus*- including music by *Guilmant, Bruhns, Buxtedude & JS Bach*.



## SUNDAY 1st OCTOBER 2023 at 3.00pm

**Richard Pilliner.** Richard's spectacular pedigree includes recitals at churches, cathedrals and concert halls across the UK, USA, Moscow, Tokyo and Hong Kong. He studied at the Royal Academy of Music (1976-1980) securing all the prizes for organ playing, accompaniment and improvisation and remains in great demand as a recitalist, teacher & accompanist.

Returning for a second series, St Paul's, Rectory Grove Recitals move from winter evenings to three consecutive early autumn Sunday afternoons at 3.00pm/6.00pm. Each concert is likely to last about an hour and light refreshments will be offered. Entry is "free" but visitors are asked to contribute to a voluntary retiring collection.

The 1881 **Forster & Andrews Organ** has the following specification – restored in 2019 by **Andrew Copper & Co Ltd** to very nearly its original condition. Apart from the electrical blowers to feed the wind supply the organ is entirely mechanical – and is mostly housed in a large room or chamber behind the façade and gold pipes that can be seen from the church pews. It might be described as a "classic" Victorian parish organ, but it enjoys immense power and great versatility.
